AGREED VOLUNTARY SURRENDER ORDER

On the 20 day of September, 2016, came on to be heard before the Texas Board of Medical Radiologic Technology (Board), duly in session, the matter of the license of Robert Noll, MRT (Respondent).

On June 23, 2016, Respondent did not appear at the Informal Show Compliance Proceeding and Settlement Conference in response to a letter of invitation from Board staff. The Board's representatives were Allan Shulkin, M.D., a member of the Board, and Philip Worley, a member of a District Review Committee (Panel). Johnathan Stone represented Board staff. Michelle McFaddin prepared this Order.

With the consent of Respondent, the Board makes the following Findings and Conclusions of Law and enters this Agreed Order.

FINDINGS

The Board finds that:

1. Respondent received all notice required by law. All jurisdictional requirements have been satisfied. Respondent waives any defect in notice and further right to notice or hearing under the Medical Radiologic Technologist Certification Act, Title 3, Subtitle K, Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 601 (Act) or the rules of the Board set forth in 25 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 140, Subchapter J.
2. Respondent currently holds Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist License No. GMR00022835. Respondent was originally issued this license on September 10, 2001. Respondent is not currently licensed in another state.
3. Respondent is 41 years of age.

4. Respondent violated the Act and related rules because he pleaded guilty to a felony indictment in 2013 and his American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) certificate was subsequently revoked.

5. By Respondent's signature on this Agreed Order, Respondent requests that the voluntary and permanent surrender of his Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist license be accepted in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings and that the voluntary and permanent surrender of his Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist license be effective on the date of entry of this Agreed Order.

6. Respondent has cooperated in the investigation of the allegations related to this Agreed Order. Respondent neither admits nor denies the information given above. To avoid further investigation, hearings, and the expense and inconvenience of litigation, Respondent agrees to the entry of this Agreed Order and to comply with its terms and conditions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above Findings, the Board concludes that:

1. The Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter and Respondent pursuant to the Act.

2. Section 601.305 of the Act and 25 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §140.514(i)(5) authorize the Board to resolve and make a disposition of this matter through an Agreed Order including an Agreed Order that provides for the voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist license.

3. This Order is based on Finding No. 4 and the specific authority of Sections 601.302(5), (9) and (10) of the Act.

ORDER

Based on the above Findings and Conclusions of Law, the Board ORDERS that:

1. The voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist license should be, and is, accepted by the Board effective on the date this Order is signed by the President of the Board.

2. Respondent's Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist License No. GMR00022835, is, therefore, permanently canceled.

3. Respondent shall immediately cease practice in Texas. Respondent's practice after the date of entry of this Agreed Order shall constitute a violation of this Order, subjecting Respondent to disciplinary action by the Board or prosecution for practicing without a license in Texas.

4. By this voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist license, Respondent resolves any complaints currently before the Board.

RESPONDENT WAIVES ANY FURTHER HEARINGS OR APPEALS TO THE BOARD OR TO ANY COURT IN REGARD TO ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREED ORDER. RESPONDENT AGREES THAT THIS IS A FINAL ORDER.

THIS ORDER IS A PUBLIC RECORD.
