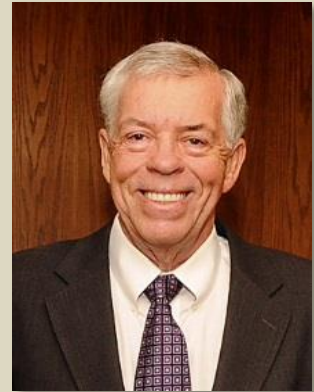

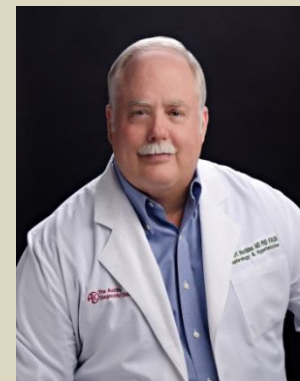
James Dickerson

Mr. Dickerson retired from Dow Chemical Company in 2004 after working for 26 years as an attorney in the company's Intellectual Property Department, serving in Texas, Michigan, California and Zurich, Switzerland. He was involved in integrating the Intellectual Property group from the former East German State Chemical Company into Dow after Germany was reunited. In addition, he was involved in integrating the intellectual property owned by Union Carbide when it merged with Dow. A 1968 graduate, Dickerson majored in chemistry and minored in biology at SFA.
