Substantial Equivalence Packet Medical School Questionnaire Basic Medical Education

Board rule 163.1(11)(B) relates to basic medical education. In part it states:

- A medical school operating outside the United States or Canada may be determined to be substantially equivalent to a Texas medical school if the medical school is designed to select and educate medical students and provide students with the opportunity to acquire a sound basic medical education through training in basic sciences and clinical sciences.

To demonstrate that the medical school meets these criteria, for the years the applicant was in medical school, the medical school Dean or President must provide the following documentation:

- a list of the required basic science and clinical science courses for all medical students
- documentation regarding the length of time for medical education
- the language(s) in which the medical education conducted, and, if more than one language, the courses conducted in each language
- if students were taught in a language other than the student's native language, information regarding the language prerequisites or assessment tool of the student's language skills prior to matriculation
- a description of how basic science and clinical science faculty and instructors and were hired
- the minimum requirements and qualifications of faculty and instructors
- the approximate number of faculty members

A copy of Form Z2 must be submitted as a cover sheet to the documentation submitted in response to the requirements noted on Form Z2.
