Substantial Equivalence Packet Medical School Questionnaire Admissions Standards and Selection of Students

Board rule 163.1(11)(B) and 163.1(11)(B)(ii) relate to admissions standards and selection of students. In part they state:

- A medical school operating outside the United States or Canada may be determined to be substantially equivalent to a Texas medical school if the medical school is designed to select and educate medical students and provide students with the opportunity to acquire a sound basic medical education through training in basic sciences and clinical sciences.
- The admissions standards shall ensure that the medical school has a pool of applicants sufficiently large and possessing United States national level qualifications to fill its entering class.
- Medical schools must select students who possess the intelligence, integrity, and personal and emotional characteristics necessary for them to become effective physicians.

To demonstrate that the medical school meets these criteria, for the year the applicant began medical school, the medical school Dean or President must provide:

- A statement including:
 - A description of the selection process and admission standards
 - A list of examinations required for admission and acceptable scores, if any
 - The required pre-medical coursework
 - Whether there were essay requirements, and if so, the requirement and evaluation criteria
 - Whether there was a formal interview, and if so, the evaluation criteria
- Catalogs or other documentation related to the selection process and admission standards

A copy of Form Z1 must be submitted as a cover sheet to the documentation submitted in response to the requirements noted on Form Z1.
