Specifies that a health care professional and/or facility is subject to disciplinary action by the appropriate regulatory agency for intentionally failing to effectuate a DNR order or issuing a DNR order in violation of the bill's requirements.	04/01/18			
HB 13 (Capriglione)	Abortion Reporting – Complications	Requires health care facilities (including hospitals and facilities providing emergency medical care) and physicians to report certain abortion complications to the Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC). Physicians at these facilities, including abortion facilities, must report on each abortion complication diagnosed or treated by that physician not later than the end of the third business day after the date on which the complication is diagnosed or treated. Physicians and facilities that commit three separate violations could be subject to disciplinary action. Requires HHSC to notify TMB of any violation committed by a physician.	11/14/17			
HB 215 (Murphy)	Abortion Reporting – Fetal Anomalies	For third trimester abortions authorized for fetal anomalies, requires physicians to certify in writing the fetal abnormality identified by the physician. HB 2561 (Thompson)	Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP), Prescription Drug Donation, & Pharmacy Board Sunset	 Adds new sections to TX Controlled Substances Act (Chpt 481, Health & Safety Code) re: PMP requirements for all licensed prescribers and dispensers. Authorizes Pharm Bd to send licensees email notifications regarding potential patterns of patient drug abuse or diversion. Requires all boards to develop guidelines on responsible prescribing of opioids, benzodiazepines, barbituates, and carisoprodol. Requires periodic monitoring of licensees' prescribing information to identify potentially harmful prescribing practices. Beginning Sept. 1, 2019, requires licensees to check patient history before prescribing or dispensing the four categories of drugs identified above. Provides exceptions for cancer patients and those in hospice. Requires a joint interim committee to study PMP monitoring and submit report by Jan. 1, 2019. Adds partial-birth abortions and certain dismemberment abortions to the list of prohibited actions applicable to physicians or applicants for a license to practice medicine, making them subject to disciplinary action or license revocation. SB 919 (Rodriguez)	PA Authority - Death Certificates	Authorizes PA or APRN to sign death certificates for certain patients receiving hospice or palliative care.	6/1/17
SB 1107 (Schwertner)	Telemedicine	 Provides new regulatory structure for establishing valid practitioner-patient relationship via telemedicine. Requires a health care service provided via telemedicine to meet the standard of care that would apply to the provision of the same health care service in an in-person setting. Prohibits an agency with regulatory authority over a health professional from adopting applicable rules imposing a higher standard of care than described by bill. Expressly excludes mental health services from statutory provisions governing telemedicine and telehealth. Requires joint rulemaking for TMB, Nursing Board, PA Board and Pharmacy Board to adopt rules establishing the determination of a valid prescription issued for telemedicine medical services. SB 1148 (Buckingham)	Maintenance of Specialty Board Certification	 Prohibits managed care insurance plan issuers from differentiating between physicians based on whether a physician had maintained a specialty board certification through periodic recertification in regard to contracing with, or paying or reimbursing, a physician. Establishes criteria by which certain hospitals and facilities, institutions, and programs are authorized or prohibited from differentiating between physicians based solely on a physician's maintenance of certification.
