## **Examination Requirements**

**Physician Licensure** 

Texas statute requires passage of a licensure examination (typically USMLE or COMLEX) acceptable to the Board. A complete listing of acceptable exams is found in Board Rule §161.7 and can be viewed at: <u>Board</u> <u>Rules</u>

## Attempt Limits

\_\_\_\_ Passage of each part of the examination within 3 attempts, or

- \_\_\_\_ If you:
  - have successfully completed a graduate medical education program approved by the board;
  - hold a full license\* and is in good standing as a physician in another state or Canada;
  - do not hold and has never held a medical license subject to any restriction, disciplinary order, or probation;
  - are not and have never been the subject of a peer review that has resulted or may result in limitation, restriction, suspension, or other adverse impact on the applicant's hospital or other medical facility privileges; and
  - are not under investigation by any licensing or law enforcement agency, then
    - If you have held a full license\* and been in active practice\*\* for at least one year and less than five years:
      - a 4th attempt allowed on one part only,
      - or up to 6 attempts allowed on one part only, if you are specialty board certified by an ABMS or BOS board
    - If you have held a full license\* and been in active practice\*\* for at least five years:
      - No limit on attempts on any part(s)

\* **Full license** - means a license to practice medicine that is not a training license, a permit, or any other form of authority to practice medicine issued to a person while the person is completing or enrolled in a residency, fellowship, or other supervised training program.

\*\* Active Practice - means the practice of medicine by a person after successful completion of a residency, fellowship, or other supervised training program.

## Time Frame for Passage of All Licensing Examination Steps

\_\_\_\_7 years, or

\_\_\_\_ 10 years if you:

- are specialty board certified by an ABMS or BOS board, or
- have practiced under a Texas FTL for 1 year

If you graduated from a combined MD/PhD or DO/PhD program, time frame extended by no later than the earlier of:

\_\_\_\_\_ Second anniversary of the completion date all graduate medical training undertaken by the applicant, including internship, residency, and fellowship, or

\_\_\_\_\_ 12 years after the start date of graduate medical training

\_\_\_ No time frame requirement if you:

- hold a license in good standing as a physician in another state;
- have been licensed for at least five years;
- do not hold a medical license in the other state that has or has ever had any restrictions, disciplinary orders, or probation; and
- will practice in a medically underserved area (MUA) or a health manpower shortage area (HPSA)

No time frame requirement if you:

- have successfully completed a graduate medical education program approved by the board;
- hold a full license\* and is in good standing as a physician in another state or Canada;
- been in active practice\*\* for at least 1 year;
- do not hold and has never held a medical license subject to any restriction, disciplinary order, or probation;
- are not and have never been the subject of a peer review that has resulted or may result in limitation, restriction, suspension, or other adverse impact on the applicant's hospital or other medical facility privileges; and
- are not under investigation by any licensing or law enforcement agency.

\* **Full license** - means a license to practice medicine that is not a training license, a permit, or any other form of authority to practice medicine issued to a person while the person is completing or enrolled in a residency, fellowship, or other supervised training program.

\*\*Active Practice - means the practice of medicine by a person after successful completion of a residency, fellowship, or other supervised training program.

## **Examination Transcripts**

- 1. If using FCVS, exam scores (USMLE, FLEX, NBME, NBOME/COMLEX, LMCC or State Board examination, etc) will be included in the FCVS packet, so no separate transcripts are required.
- 2. If not using FCVS, you must contact all examination agencies and request that a certified transcript of all examination attempts be sent directly to the Texas Medical Board.
